About the Program

The B.S. Degree in Human Services requires a **minimum of 120 credit hours** including 60 transferrable college credit hours that must be completed prior to applying to the program. Total program hours may vary based on the student's individual degree plan.

Lower division and general education coursework requirements may have been fulfilled during the completion of the student's associate degree.

Lower Division Coursework

Credit Hours: 45

The lower division elective coursework requirement may be fulfilled with may associate in arts elective coursework, associate in science professional coursework or associate in science professional elective coursework previously earned by the student. Please see an advisor for individual guidance.

Lower division coursework must be completed with a grade of C or higher.

Important for You to Know

This academic roadmap does not include:

- MAT 1033: Intermediate Algebra**, which, for many students, is a prerequisite course for MAC 1105;
- AMH 2020: United States History From 1877 to the Present** or **POS 2041: American Federal Government**, one of which must be completed with a grade of C or higher to satisfy the course requirement for the Civic Literacy Requirement; and
- Foreign Language courses**, which students may use to fulfill the Foreign Language Requirements.
