## GENERAL INFORMATION:

Based on the information you have provided, Florida State College at Jacksonville will determine your residency status for tax purposes. This status determines whether the College withholds taxes on any payments, you may receive from the institution. Your tax status does not necessarily correspond with your INS classification.

You will either be a resident alien or a non-resident alien for tax purposes. If you are determined to be a resident alien for tax purposes, you are required to follow all tax laws applicable to a U.S. citizen. If you are determined to be a non-resident alien for tax purposes, Florida State College at Jacksonville will withhold the required taxes from all scholarships, grants and earnings paid to you by the College. After the calendar year has passed, the College will mail a 1042-S to you to file with your U.S. federal income taxes. To determine how to file your taxes as a non-resident alien, please refer to IRS publication 519. IRS publications, forms and instructions can be found at irs.gov.

As a resident or non-resident alien, you may be entitled to certain tax benefits under a treaty between your country of residence and the United States. Additional documentation must be submitted to the College if you are claiming eligibility for tax benefits from a tax treaty. For additional information on tax treaties and their benefits, please use IRS publication 901.
