About the Program

The Associate in Science (A.S.) Degree in Network Systems Technology provides students with computer-related technical skills for the I.T. industry.

Students may focus one of the following tracks: Network Support Technician, Network Infrastructure, Advanced Network Visualization, Digital Forensics, Network Enterprise Administration or IP Communications.

This program requires a **minimum of 60 credit hours**. Total program hours may vary based on the student's individual academic degree plan. This program **is eligible** for financial aid.

This academic roadmap does not include developmental education courses in reading, writing, and/or mathematics or other prerequisite courses that you may be required to take. In addition, it does not include program graduation requirements.

Upon completion of this program, student will be prepared to pursue industry recognized certifications such as CompTIA's A+ Microcomputer Technician certification, Network+, Security+, Microsoft, VMware, Citrix, and Cisco.
