About the Program

The Career Certificate (C.C.) in Florida Law Enforcement provides students with exceptional law enforcement learning opportunities in subjects including evidence gathering, investigation and criminal law, traffic control, patrol procedures and weaponry training.

Students will attain the knowledge and skills needed for such career options as certified Florida Law Enforcement Officer and Sworn Bailiff. **A Related Career Pathways** includes the A.S. in Criminal Justice Technology.

This program requires **770 contact/clock hours** that must be completed and documented. Students should also understand and accept the attendance requirements prior to enrolling in this career certificate program. This program **is eligible** for financial aid.

Program Requirements

This is a Limited Access Program.

This academic roadmap does not include career certificate graduation requirements.

Upon completion of this program along with a passing score on the State Officer Certification Examination, students will obtain a Certificate of Law Enforcement valid throughout the State of Florida. This is a basic certification, and additional training will be required by the hiring agency.

Day program classes are held Monday through Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m., for 5 months. **Night program** classes are held Monday through Friday, 6 p.m.-10 p.m., for 11 months. The curriculum for both programs is identical.

Upon successful completion of the program, **students may receive articulated College credit** toward the Criminal Justice Technology (2239) (A.S.) degree.
